## **DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE (1776)**

**Instructions:** Read the topics from the document and write down talking points for in class discussion. The most famous sentence from the Declaration of Independence: **WE** hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness

#### 1. WE HOLD THESE TRUTHS TO BE SELF-EVIDENT, THAT ALL MEN ARE CREATED EQUAL

ARE WE ALL CREATED EQUAL? IS IT A TRUTH? GIVE YOUR OPINION AND EXAMPLES. TOPICS TO CONSIDER: WHEN AFRICAN-AMERICANS WERE LEGALLY DEEMED 3/5THS OF A PERSON TO ENABLE THE CONTINUING THE PRACTICE OF SLAVERY (1787 – 1861), ENSLAVEMENT OF NATIVE AMERICANS ALONG WITH AFRICAN-AMERICANS (1700'S), THE SCALP ACT OF 1756, BRACERO PROGRAM – MEXICAN FARM LABOR SUPPLY PROGRAM IMPORTED APPROXIMATELY 350,000 MEXICANS ANNUALLY TO WORK AS FARM LABOR (1951 – 1964). OBJECTIFICATION OF HUMANS.

### 2. THAT THEY ARE ENDOWED ... WITH CERTAIN UNALIENABLE RIGHTS,

What does **unalienable Rights** mean? **Topics to Consider:** The Dred Scot court decision Denied **African-American slaves** Citizenship (1857), Plessy vs. Ferguson - Separate but Equal (1868), **Women** not guaranteed the right to vote until the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution (1920), **miscegenation laws** (1700's – 1967), California - **Chinese** Exclusion Act Denying Chinese Citizenship (1866-1898), Limits Number of Immigrants (1921) and Deportation of **Mexicans** begins (1932 - Present), Operation Wetback, 3.8 Million Mexican Deported (1954 – 1958).

### 3. ...AMONG THESE ARE LIFE,

What do you think the founding fathers of the United States meant when they declared 'Life' to be one of the unalienable Rights?

Topics to consider: abortion, the death penalty, war, Lynching (No mandatory punishment until 1964), Euthanasia, and Quality of Life...

#### 4. **LIBERTY** AND

What do you think the founding fathers of the United States meant when they declared 'Liberty' to be one of the unalienable Rights?

Topics to Consider: Slavery (1700's to 1865), Japanese-American Internment Camps (1942-1946), Arizona SB 1070 Law – Lawful Stop, Detention & Arrest of Mexicans meant to curb Illegal Immigration but means you can stop any Mexican and demand to see their citizenship papers (2010), Guantanamo Bay Muslims (2002- Present)

Detained indefinitely without trial...

#### 5. THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS. —

What do you think the founding fathers of the United States meant when they declared 'pursuit of Happiness' to be one of the unalienable Rights?

Topics to Consider: (Define Happiness) and discuss the various perspective on what happiness is. Topic to consider: Legalization of Marijuana, Legalization of Alcohol, addictions, Legalization of Prostitution.

# DUTY TO PROTEST - IN THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

Excerpts of complaints against King George and England by the 13 colonies listed in the Declaration of Independence.

How might some of these complaints be evident in the past that instigated protests or warranted amendments?

How might some of these complaints or injustices be currently observable? What actions were taken to rectify the injustices?

# **CALL TO ACTION:**

...whenever **any Form of Government becomes destructive** ... it is the Right of the People to **alter** or to abolish it, **Consider:** (Bill of Rights Amendments through protest and course cases).

...and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.

...when a long train of abuses and usurpations ... it is their right, it is their duty ... to provide new Guards for their future security.

	Consider: Lynching, JOD findings for Ferguson, Sandra Bland, Mexican Farm Workers
	For depriving us, in many Cases, of the Benefits of Trial by Jury.
	Consider: Guantanamo, Japanese Internment Camps
	tried for pre-tended Offences. Consider: Lynching, Trayvon Martin
	In every stage of these Oppressions we have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble
	Terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated Injury.
	<b>Consider:</b> Non-violent protests and their repercussions.
